

# Controlling The Traffic Flow!

**T**he addition of 60 trucks travelling on Route 32, Monday thru Friday, to and from the ash landfill proposed by the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority in Franklin will NOT have an adverse impact on the flow of traffic in the area.

This is the conclusion of the Eastern Connecticut Environmental Review Team, the independent consultants who are analyzing the ash landfill proposal for the Franklin Board of Selectmen. The

Environmental Review Team reported in March that Route 32 has experienced a decline in the volume of traffic beginning in 2003. It went on to conclude that, “these volumes indicate that Route 32 has the capacity to safely handle the additional 60 trucks per day stated by CRRA.”

CRRA is committed to ensuring that safe operating conditions exist for through traffic as well as traffic going in and out of the ash landfill.
